DHA Academic High School Course Schedule **2023 - 2024**

High school courses are offered a la carte. High school students, grades 9th - 12th, are eligible to enroll in any of the courses listed above (with the exception of English courses, which are grade-specific). Students may enroll in up to 5 courses. Each course is offered for a full year. We plan to offer additional course options in future years as we grow.

DHA classes will be held on Mondays and Wednesdays, with home assignments provided for the remainder of the week. Parents are responsible for overseeing their student's at-home work, maintaining documentation, determining final grades, and compiling a high school transcript for their student.

Tuition & Fees

1 course: \$75/month

**Families with more than one student attending DHA Academic will receive \$5 off each high school course per month.*

Science courses will require a one-time lab fee of \$50.

Math courses will require a one-time copy fee of \$40

Study Hall

Students who are not signed up for a full day of courses (5 courses) may stay on campus for a study hall time. Study hall expectations will be provided to students and parents at the beginning of the year, and students must follow those expectations in order to participate in study hall.

Study hall periods require a monthly fee of \$20/student per class period, with a maximum of 3 study hall periods per day.

Curriculum

Parents are responsible for purchasing textbooks and materials for each course. A specific textbook list will be provided soon. Here is some brief information about each course:

- Science, history, and Spanish 1 courses will utilize materials from BJU Press.
- English 9 & English 10/11: These courses will cover basic Writing & Composition skills. Novel studies will be included throughout the course as well.
- Math: Math courses will utilize curriculum from “All Things Algebra.” Copied chapter packets will be provided to students throughout the year, so no textbook purchase will be required.
 - **Algebra Bridge:** Do you feel that your high school student could use additional time to prepare for Algebra? This is the course for students that need to take a little longer to develop those algebra ready skills. We will focus on the following units: Computation Skills Review, Solving Linear Equations, Proportions, Functions, Graphing Linear Functions, Systems of Linear Functions and Exponent Rules. Within those units, supplemental geometry skills will be introduced. This course will lay a strong foundation for success in Algebra the following year.
 - **Algebra 1:** This course will include the following units: Multi-Step Equations and Inequalities, Relations and Functions, Linear Equations and Inequalities, Systems of Linear Functions, Exponential Functions, Polynomials and Factoring, Quadratic Functions and Radical Expressions. We will move at a steady pace throughout the year to complete the curriculum. Students taking algebra should have solid computation skills, be able to solve a multi-step equation and understand the coordinate plane.
